Details	Level Orange – Blended Learning
Participants	<p>- Blended Learning (Contingency Only) • In-class learning is suspended. Teacher led remote learning with some limited use of schools ☒</p> <p>Teacher-directed remote learning is an essential component of K to 12 education throughout the pandemic</p> <p>When remote learning is needed, students may work independently on their own, as well as work with a teacher in real time.</p> <p>Blended in-class and remote learning plans may need to be implemented on short notice and may be in response to isolation due to illness from exposures.</p> <p>Parents must screen students before they come to school each day.</p> <p>A student becoming ill is to be picked up ASAP</p>
School Day Structure	
Timetables	<p>K to 8 will attend school 5 days a week.</p> <p>Any classes not able to maintain a two metres of physical distancing will be split.</p> <p>Grade 9 to 12 should be able to attend five days a week based on Grade K at 8 need for spacing.</p> <p>Grade 9 to 12 may attend alternate days for both in class and remote learning if necessary</p> <p>Class cohorts can operate within a school setting at the same time as we have cohorts of less than 75 students</p> <p>Virtual classrooms may be implemented for Gr. 9 to 12 if needed</p>

Arrival/Dismissal	<p>Parents will bring their students to the south entrance of the school</p> <p>Students will be asked the Covid-19 questions before entry</p> <p>Students will use hand sanitizer/hand washing upon entry and be escorted directly to class</p> <p>At the end of the scheduled time, parents will pick up students at the south door</p>
Movement of Students	<p>K to Gr. 12 will have staggered times for recess/breaks and washroom use.</p> <p>Start and end times for recess and classes will be staggered for the minimum of interaction between classroom groups.</p> <p>Each group from K to 6 will go out for recess so students are separated and the doorways cleaned before the next group exits.</p> <p>Upon re-entry students will come in groups and immediately use sanitizer/hand washing then go immediately to class</p> <p>Students wash hands before and after recess - Students follow physical distancing with support from supervision staff - Individual cohorts have their own play equipment (e.g. soccer balls, etc..) and it must be cleaned between uses - Recesses are staggered in order to support less congestion and less group sizes</p> <p>Lunch recess will follow the same pattern. Students will eat their lunches in the assigned classrooms</p> <p>Gr. 7 to 12 will have staggered washroom breaks in the morning and the afternoon.</p> <p>Gr. 7 to 12 will eat lunch in their assigned homerooms.</p>
Academic Program	
Classroom Configuration	<p>Students will be expected to maintain physical distancing when in the building—hallways and homeroom</p> <p>Gr. K to 8 will follow the procedures of the yellow level</p> <p>Grade 9 to 12 will follow the same procedures when in the building</p>

Instruction	<p>Instruction will be provided to individuals and small groups</p> <p>Students will have team meetings on the internet as an option for classroom attendance</p> <p>packages will be prepared for students who have limited access</p> <p>The focus of K to 8 will be on the core courses with integration of other subjects.</p> <p>The focus of the Gr. 9 to 12 will be on the regular timetable of subjects</p>
Assessment and Reporting	<p>Assessments will be conducted to determine the individual needs of students.</p> <p>Reading Assessment Kits are available to support student assessment</p> <p>Reading Intervention Programs are available to support reading intervention/recovery</p> <p>Parents will be kept informed by phone, parent portal and with the monthly progress reports that are issued by each teacher each month.</p> <p>Communication from parents to teachers is encouraged throughout the year especially during the early start of this year.</p>
School Supplies and Personal Belongings	<p>Masks have been issued to all students</p> <p>Students coming to the school will bring their own school supplies and masks</p> <p>Special projects will have supplies provided by the school</p>
Alternate Learning Spaces	
Gym	<p>The gym will be available as an addition space for classroom use</p> <p>The gym may be available at times during the day or after hours for use.</p>
Library	<p>The library will be available as an additional space for classroom use.</p> <p>Library books for classroom use will be put in classrooms by the teacher or librarian at intervals for students to use</p>
Common Area/Canteen	<p>The canteen is not available for food sales.</p>

	<p>The canteen is available for the breakfast program and for lunch preparation</p> <p>This area is to be unused as it is the entrance area for students</p> <p>The East entrance area is to be unused during the day.</p> <p>Seating in the hallway will have limited use</p> <p>All students are expected to bring lunches that do not require microwave heating or assistance of staff to open the product.</p>
Transition to school	<p>Parents are asked to transport their own children to and from school. If not possible the Division will provide transportation to eligible students.</p>
Student Well-Being	<p>Focus on supporting their emotional, social, and mental health as we welcome them back to adjusting to an in-school setting</p> <p>We have access to the division social worker on a weekly basis and as needed, the support of the teaching staff, educational assistants and the community connector daily throughout the school day</p> <p>Teach rules and routines</p> <p>Teach public health and safety rules and expectations</p>
