#### ACADEMIC ASSESSMENT

Assessment will be based on a variety of activities that cater to the various learning styles of students. Assessment will be ongoing, and based largely on effort, and fulfilling each assignments requirements based on provided rubrics. Peer and self-assessment will also be used throughout the year. All projects will be weighted out of 100. All content is cumulative and will contribute towards 100% of the final grade. All content will be reported on in the following categories, as per the Manitoba Report card requirements. This will be reported on in a percentage, as well as a 1-4.

- Language and Tools
- Creative Expression
- Knowledge and Understanding
- Analysis and Communication
